Kansas State Capitol

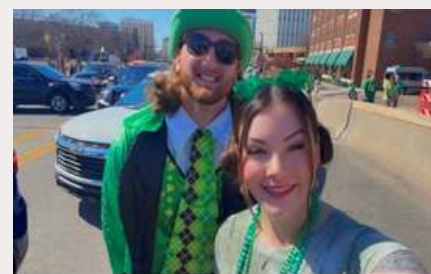

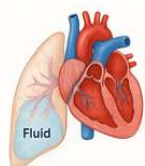


February is National Heart Month

What is Congestive Heart Failure (CHF)?

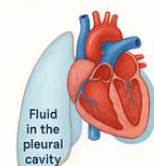
CHF is a chronic condition in which the heart doesn't pump blood as well as it should. Heart Failure can occur if the heart cannot pump (systolic) or fill (diastolic) adequately. Symptoms include shortness of breath, fatigue, swollen legs, and rapid heartbeat. CHF is not curable, but with early detection, medical treatment, proper diet and medication, and lifestyle changes, may help improve your quality of life.

Left-Sided CHF



- Thickened walls of the left ventricle
- Fluid backs up into the lungs

Right-Sided CHF



- Fluid in the pleural cavity
- Fluid backs up in the abdomen or limbs
